

New Teachers – Challenges

Common Challenges

- Burdened by curricular freedom
- Lack of understanding of students from different year levels
- Lack of knowledge of the school-wide language programme
- Burnout

Middle School (Year 7 – 9)

- Balance between behaviour management, use of ICT activities & effective input
- Students' biased attitudes towards Chinese/language learning

VCE (Year 11 &12)

- Lack of training & mentorship
- Lack of time allowance

New Teachers – Things to keep in mind/try out

1. Learning from experienced colleagues

□ Ask SPECIFIC questions

Contribute your ideas and thoughts

□ Attend PDs with learning intentions

2. Be a sponge

□ Learning from experience - teaching

□ Instant post-class reflections (What went well? What could be done differently? Consider contextual factors)

3. Looking after yourself

□ Try ONE new thing per term

□ Involve students to be part of the problem – solving processes (i.e., behaviour management; content selection; ICT activities etc.)

Be flexible

4. Creating your own class routine, culture & work system

□ Teach in a way that suits YOU and your students

5. Reframing students' perspective on language learning

Use personal stories & language learning experiences

Language learning is a life-long journey, develops transferable skills

Teaching Resources – Challenges

Common Challenges

Scattered resources (various textbooks, supplementary resources & ICT assisted resources)

□ Repetitive cultural content

Middle School (Year 7 – 9)

□ Lack of appropriate and engaging Chinese movies

VCE (Year 11 & 12)

Lack of standardised resources
For example, model essays & responses

□ Lack of guidance for marking rubric for SACS & exams

Teaching Resources – The Magical Power of OneNote

□ There is no perfect textbook.

Differentiation - Variability in students' levels


□ How to ensure the continuity & consistency

How to maintain students' motivation while making sure students are developing their language proficiency


