Listening Opportunities 听力机会

- start with listening conscious & subconscious
- more allowance for listening support materials
 - repeated use of listening tracks
 - tailored listening quizzes
 - songs
 - EP & Duolingo

Inaccuracies with Pinyin 拼音问题

For example: zh/j = the same hard 'j' 四 sì、七 qī、十 shí: Each 'i' is different 学 xué = schwear 岁 suì = sway

Pronunciation Guide for Pinyin



- physical connection
- exaggeration
- write them or visualise them

Characters 汉字

• focus on the radicals and components

e.g 女 Female Radical <u>https://youtu.be/_a_D86MioWs</u>

• make a story or personal connection

e.g. Family Member Characters https://youtu.be/NZZIm26Pnko

The Initial Hurdle 开始的障碍

- understanding the basics (pinyin, tones, character components) takes longer – compared to European languages which have a familiar alphabet for speakers of English
- don't feel like they are progressing
- conundrum make it easy or get them learning?

Perception that Chinese is too hard 感觉中文太难

- tricks to simplify it
 - pinyin (modified pronunciation guide)
 - characters (focus on components & take time to make a personal connection)
- emphasise the simplicities of Chinese grammar
 - fewer conjugations of verbs
 - very few plurals (们)
 - no matching genders

Competition from Background Speakers 来自中国背景的竞争

- fear of speaking in front of them
- encourage them to use the chance to practise
- treat it as a game
- VCE Chinese Language Culture & Society
- don't have to study to VCE level to gain benefits

Fear of Oral Examinations 对口语考试的恐惧

- practice
- use it in the community

Interruptions 学习的中断

- absences, music lessons, school events etc.
- topic movies of core sentence structures & vocabulary – good for absentees and for support & extension

<u>买东西 Shopping Movie</u>

Differentiation 因材施教

- one of the toughest challenges
- needed for support & extension
- topic movies, self-marking quizzes, EP, are very helpful for both support & extension but take time to make and adjust

Technical Challenges 技术性挑战

- basic technical challenges, such as adding keyboards & variation in software between students
- on-line translators create an obstacle

- availability of new electives
- teacher movement
- technological change
